<b>BAK Fridays</b>	Is an every Friday event which happened throughout the year. The team, supervised by Jacqueline Ranganai, Amanda, Blessing, Tawanda and Mai Maka, embarked on a program to teach children on academics, games, swimming, sewing, cooking and personal development. Also, the travel with the children to areas like snake and cheetah park.	The team faced challenged in terms of limited resources to sustain their operations. As young people they also required a stipend and the organisation could afford \$5/week.
<b>Soccer</b>	The organisation runs a BAK Printers FC, a social soccer team for young adults and participate in soccer tournaments and matches on a weekly basis. The team is sustained by weekly players' weekly subscriptions of \$1/week.	The team is doing well in terms of social development but it would achieve more if there's funding and can extend to include young boys and girls.
<b>Zimbabwe Trip Reports</b>	A 12-member team travelled to Zimbabwe in August 2018. They took part in programs in which BAK is involved in. they travelled to Chegutu, Norton and to other institutions around Harare. They also erected a fence at BAK Centre, Chadcombe. The team trained kids in swimming, soccer and etc.	Another team is travelling to Zimbabwe in 2019 August.
<b>School Fees Program</b>	The organisation is running and financing a scholarship scheme which is currently housing 30 children from Honours Academy from Chegutu. The organisation source funds from organisation's well-wishers and they also provide the children with school shoes, uniforms and books. The wishers also promote children with talents and interests in sports	The program is on-going and hoping to expand our donors base and thus the beneficiaries.
